### **Project Overview**

- Girls Go Circular (GGC) is coordinated by EIT RawMaterials, with the support of the EIT Community and the Directorate-General for Education, Youth, Sport, and Culture (DG EAC).
- The initiative equips schoolgirls aged 14-19 across Europe with digital and entrepreneurial skills through an online learning platform on the circular economy.

Girls Go Circular is active in several Ukrainian cities, supporting the students affected by war.










# Learning Platform & Methodology

- Circular Learning Space is Girls Go Circular's online learning platform:
  - 18 learning modules exploring digital tools and the circular economy in different industries
  - 24 languages
  - +90,000 registered users
- The teaching methodology is based on a **learning-by-doing** approach, engaging students in challenge-based exercises such as creating app mock-ups, developing product prototypes, or planning business models.
- Alignment with **DigComp**, **EntreComp**, and **GreenComp**.
- A Teacher Guidebook is available in all programme languages.


### Join Us!
